




Fact: Tax policies affect investment decisions.

Tell the Alaska Legislature that action is needed NOW to stop Alaska's oil production decline!

High oil prices coupled with new technology have created a boom in the oil and gas industry across the country and world. Alaska, however, is missing out on this boom, and it is no secret why: Alaska's oil taxes are too high, and companies are taking their investment dollars elsewhere.



With more than 90 percent of the State's spending money coming from oil and gas revenues, and thousands of jobs at stake, it is imperative that the legislature act now.

AOGA supports Governor Parnell's guiding principles that any oil tax reform plan must adhere to:

- Tax reform must be fair to Alaskans.
- Tax reform must encourage new production.
- Tax reform must be simple, so that it restores balance to the system.
- Tax reform has to be durable for the long term.

Now is the time to encourage the Legislature to take steps to reverse Alaska's accelerated oil production decline.

Public hearings will be held at statewide Legislative Information Offices (LIOs) **this Tuesday and Thursday, January 29 and 31**. This is the first opportunity for Alaskans to speak up and tell lawmakers that continued decline is unacceptable, and urgent action is needed to fix the problem.

Please take a moment this week to provide brief testimony urging the legislature to make policy changes **this session** to attract new investment and increase North Slope production.

On Tuesday the 29th, testimony will be taken in Juneau, and at the LIOs in Anchorage, Fairbanks, Mat-Su, Kotzebue, Nome, Tok, Valdez, and Unalaska between **5:30-7:30 p.m.**

On Thursday the 31st, testimony will be taken at LIOs from Seward, Ketchikan, Sitka, Petersburg, Wrangell, Barrow, Bethel, Cordova, Delta Junction, Dillingham, Glennallen, and Juneau between **4-7 p.m.**
